Conference Information

Morning Sessions

The two-hour morning sessions will use case transcripts to illustrate the theory and show its clinical applications. Separate sessions will be offered for returnees and for first-time Conference participants. Returning participants can present their own case material in the morning group.

A 2-hour morning session is followed by a lunch break and then two 2-hour afternoon sessions each day.

Afternoon Sessions

Theoretical Discussions

The two-hour afternoon sessions will include discussions of the core precepts of control mastery theory including the etiology of pathology, plan formulations, and testing

Clinical Applications

In small case conferences, Control Mastery theory will be applied to treatment of adults, children, adolescents, difficult cases, persons in crisis, and couple therapy. Participants are encouraged and invited to present their own cases in many of the classes.

Control Mastery Case Consultation

We will again offer the chance to have a no fee private 70-minute case consultation with a Control-Mastery therapist. We will arrange these consultations for Thursday, March 2nd from 3:15 until 4:30 p.m. If you are interested in a consultation, please check the box on the registration form. In addition, those interested in research may sign up for consultation with Control Mastery researchers.

Target Audience

Intermediate and advanced level mental health clinicians; therapists interested in psychotherapy research; mental health educators. Students and interns are also welcome.

Educational Objectives

Participants will learn:

- How to understand the role of trauma in the development of psychopathology;
- How pathogenic beliefs develop;
- How to develop a plan formulation;
- How patients test their therapists;
- How to apply Control Mastery theory to a variety of patient populations and treatments;
- How Control Mastery was developed and empirically investigated.
